Herb Livsey, Denver Nuggets Scout

Herb Livsey joined the Denver Nuggets in 2008 after scouting for the Atlanta Hawks (2004-08) and the Portland Trail Blazers (1998-2004). Prior to his tenure with the NBA, Herb coached high school and college basketball while working as an English Professor at various schools in Nevada, California and Arizona for 37 years before joining the Continental Basketball Association as a player development director in 1996. In 1998, Mark Warkentien hired him as a scout with the Portland Trail Blazers. He took a brief retirement in 2008, until Warkentien asked Herb to come back as a scout in Denver.

Herb has always followed his instincts on players, whether he is observing a player for several days at a college practice in Kentucky, as he did with Kenneth Faried, or watching a game in the rural Midwest, Herb sticks to his instincts - part of the reason the three General Managers in 7 years at Denver Nuggets have kept, and listened to Herb.

Throughout 1961-2002, he owned and directed Snow Valley Basketball School in Santa Barbara, California every summer. From 1996-2010, he worked in Player Development for various NIKE programs in the USA and Europe.

Randle's contract made him the NFL's highest paid defensive player with unprecedented guarantees that have become the norm in the most lucrative NFL contracts. Other Premier clients included Pro Bowlers Eric Allen, Keenan McCardell and Jimmy Smith. Joel served as a consultant with Management

Plus for several years after starting Premier. As a consultant, he played an integral part in the negotiation of Shaquille O'Neal's Los Angeles Lakers contracts (\$120 million over 7 years & subsequent 3-year, \$88.3 million extension).

In 2012, Joel became a contributing writer for the National Football Post. He uses his NFL salary cap and collective bargaining agreement knowledge to provide a perspective on player salaries, contract negotiations and the salary cap that is rarely seen in the media. In 2013, Joel began writing for CBSSports.com on similar topics, but for a larger audience. Joel also appears regularly on radio shows, including SiriusXM NFL Radio.

Dean Oliver, Sacramento Kings Director of Player Personnel and Analytics

Dean Oliver began with the Kings as Director of Player Personnel and Analytics in the 2014-15 season. Dean is known broadly as a pioneer in the analytics that help govern many basketball teams, from the NBA down to high school. His book, Basketball on Paper, was written at the same time as Moneyball and helped him to enter the NBA in 2004, working for the Seattle Supersonics. He soon joined the Denver Nuggets as Director of Quantitative Analysis and was part of several very successful teams and the Nuggets VP won Executive of the Year once during his tenure. Dean went to ESPN for the lockout of the 2011 season, where he headed up the construction of their sports analytics group, working on both basketball and football with talent, producers, technology, and executives at the company.

He earned a bachelor's degree in engineering at Caltech while playing on the basketball team. He did his Ph.D. in environmental engineering at North Carolina and Stanford while serving as an advanced scout in college basketball. His work has been published in numerous places, is in regular use on television and radio, and he is often asked to give talks to business and educational groups. In the summer of 2011, Gatlin served as the sole representative of the United States, out of 38 countries present, when he attended the Euroleague's MasterMind Coaching Seminar in Barcelona, Spain. Later that summer, he served as the appointed liaison for the Belgium Senior Men's National Team during their ten-day training camp held in Frisco, TX in preparation for the European Championship.

In addition to his work with the Legends, Tyler plays an active role in the ABA. He was hired as the General Manager of the Dallas Impact, at age 23, he created and hosted the first-ever "Tri-State Showcase," handled all necessary administrative and organizational tasks associated with team, and guided the organization through a successful season. Under Gatlin, Impact finished with a winning record and a playoff appearance during the 2010-11 season.

Last season as an assistant coach, Tyler helped North Dallas to a record of 12-1 (W-L). He was also an integral part of our deep run through the playoffs to the ABA's Final Four. Larry Riley, Former Golden State Warriors GM and Splash Brothers Recruiter

Larry Riley, who has 27 years of experience in the NBA, recently retired from the Golden State Warriors as Director of Scouting. Prior, Larry was the General Manager of the Warriors, bringing in top guys such as Stephen Curry 7th overall in 2009, Klay Thompson in 2011, All-Star David Lee via a sign and trade with New York and has since had a hand in the wildly successful 2012 draft that brought the team Harrison Barnes, Festus Ezeli, and Draymond Green. Larry spent three seasons with the Warriors as Assistant Coach and Assistant GM before being promoted to GM in 2009.

Riley arrived at Golden State after spending the previous six seasons (2000-01 thru 2005-06) with the Dallas Mavericks, where he served the last four campaigns as an assistant coach and NBA advance scout. Prior to joining the Mavericks, Riley served a six-year stint (1994-95 thru 1999-00) as the director of player personnel for the

Vancouver Grizzlies. In that role, he oversaw the team's scouting of professional, college and international players and advised the team on all player-related transactions. Riley also spent six years (1988-89 thru 1993-94) with the Milwaukee Bucks organization as an assistant coach and scout. While with the Bucks he was responsible for advance scouting of NBA opponents, CBA, USBL and college scouting. Riley originally broke into the NBA when he was originally with the Bucks in 1988 as a scout and video coordinator.

Before entering the NBA, Riley was the head coach at Eastern New Mexico for ten years from 1978-88, where he developed the program into an NAIA powerhouse and helped the program transition up to NCAA Division II. Riley, who owns 45 years of basketball coaching and administrative experience overall, was also the head coach at Chadron State in Nebraska for two seasons from 1976-78. Additionally, he served assistant coaching stints at Southeast Missouri State (1969-70), Wisconsin-Milwaukee (1970-73), Brevard Community College (1973-74) and Mercer (1974-76).

This year yet again promises to be a tournament loaded with talent as the best players in the world prepare for the upcoming season. Spectators at the 2015 NBA Summer League in Vegas will have the opportunity to watch 9 of the 14 lottery picks from this last year's draft compete to get a leg-up on their new teammates, and try to secure a spot in the starting 5. In 2014 the Sacramento Kings won the Las Vegas NBA Summer League by defeating the Houston Rockets by a score of 77-68. Glen Rice Jr. of the Washington Wizards was named MVP of the league and Ray McCallum of the Sacramento Kings was named MVP of the championship game.


